Chemistry of life in space:a clue to its diversity and complexity

The origin of life is central in the field of Exobiology and can be approached from different aspects. Our researches focus on the origin of the organic matter, on the key element for life, that could have been heritated from space. By reproducing the conditions in space (molecular clouds, comets, asteroids), we simulate the organic matter evolution and highlight the huge diveristy of abiotic organic compounds that can be produced in extraterestrial settings. We show that the building blocks of life (amino acids, sugars) can be easely formed there and could have been brought to the early Earth by meteorites. However, this is not enough for the emergence of life and other processes have occurred on the early Earth.
